MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 READ TOGETHER

Read a book with a child or share a favorite story.

Try asking:

"What do you think will happen next?"

Everyone can participate: Families • Educators • Libraries • Healthcare Professionals • Communities

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 TALK TOGETHER

Start a conversation with a child.

Try asking:

"What was your favorite part of your day?"

Every conversation builds language, vocabulary, and connection.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23 SING TOGETHER

Sing a favorite song, nursery rhyme, or silly tune.

Songs and rhymes help children play with sounds, words, and language.

Your favorite song can become a literacy moment.

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24 SHARE A STORY

Share a favorite book, family story, childhood memory, storyteller, educator, or literacy resource.

Ask:

"What's a story you love to share?"

Stories connect generations and communities.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25 CONNECT WITH YOUR LIBRARY

Visit your local library. Find a new book. Attend a program. Get a library card. Ask a librarian for a recommendation.

Your next great story is waiting.

FAMILIES

Make literacy visible in your community. Share Georgia Reads messaging and connect residents with local resources.



COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

Add a literacy moment to something you already do. Share a story, recommend a book, or connect families to resources.
